

Manor Estates Housing Association Privacy Notice MEHA Factoring Customer (How we use your personal information)

This notice explains what information we collect, when we collect it and how we use this. During the course of our activities we will process personal data (which may be held on paper, electronically, or otherwise) about you and we recognise the need to treat it in an appropriate and lawful manner. The purpose of this notice is to make you aware of how we will handle your information.

Who are we?

Manor Estates Housing Association is a Scottish Charity (Scottish Charity Number SCO23106), a registered society under the Co-operative and Community Benefit Societies Act 2014 with Registered Number 2484R(S) and has their Registered Office at 11 Washington Lane, Edinburgh EH11 2HA. We take the issue of security and data protection very seriously and strictly adhere data protection legislation, including the UK General Data Protection Regulation, the Data Protection Act 2018 and Privacy and Electronic Communications Regulations..

We are notified as a Data Controller with the Office of the Information Commissioner's Office under registration number Z6870536 and we are the data controller of any personal data that you provide to us.

How we collect information from you and the type of information we collect

We collect information about you

- When you become an owner of a property to which the Association provides factoring services;
- When you become a private tenant of a property to which the Association provides factoring services;
- When you request services from us or otherwise provide us with your personal details;
- From your use of our online services, whether to report and factoring issues, make a complaint or otherwise;
- From your arrangements to make payments to us (such as employment details, benefit entitlement and any other income and expenditure information.

We may collect the following information about you

- Name:

- Next of Kin;

- Other third party contact details;
- Employment details;
- Any other personal data, including special category personal data which you provide us with

We receive the following information from third parties

- Payments made by you to us;
- Complaints or other communications

Why we need this information about you and how it will be used

We need your information and will use your information

- To perform our obligations and duties to you in accordance with our Written Statement of Services;
- To enable us to supply you with the services and information which you have requested;
- To enable us to respond to your repair request;
- To enable us to respond to a complaint you have made;
- To contact you in order to send you details of any changes to our services which may affect you;
- To contact your for your views on our services;
- To analyse the information we collect so the we can administer, improve and develop our business and the services we offer.

Sharing of your information

The information you provide to us will be treated by us as confidential and will be processed only by our employees within the UK/EEA. We may disclose your information to other third parties who act for us for the purposes set out in this notice or for purposes approved by you, including the following:

- If we instruct repair or maintenance works, your information may be shared with any contractor appointed by us to carry out the works;
- If we are investigating a complaint, information may be disclosed to Police Scotland, relevant local authority departments. Scottish Fire & Rescue Service and others involved in the investigation of a complaint;
- If we are investigating payments made or debts outstanding, your information may be disclosed to payment processors or debt collection agencies;
- If we are taking action against you, your information may be disclosed to our legal representatives;
- If we are conducting a survey of our services, your information may be disclosed to third parties assisting in the compilation and analysis of the survey results.
- If we enter into a joint venture with or merge with another business entity, your information may be disclosed to our new business partners or owners.

Unless required to do so by law, we will not otherwise share, sell or distribute any of the information you provide to us without your consent.

The lawful basis for processing your personal data

Under the UK General Data Protection Regulation, the lawful bases which we rely on for processing this information are:

- We have your consent
- We have a contractual obligation, including pre-contractual negotiations
- We have a legal obligation
- We have a vital interest
- We have a legitimate interest

Transfers outside the UK and the European Economic Area

Your information will only be stored within the UK and EEA.

Were information to be transferred outside the UK or EEA we will ensure that there are adequate safeguards in place to protect your information in accordance with this notice.

Security

When you give us information we take steps to make sure that your personal information is kept secure and safe.

- All electronic files are password protected and may only be accessed by authorised staff in the performance of their duties.;
- Paper files are retained in locked cabinets and only accessed by authorised staff;
- Information transferred to contractors (name, address and contact details) is securely managed and we ensure contractors are GDPR compliant.

How long will we keep your information

We review our data retention periods regularly and will only hold your personal data for as long as is necessary for the relevant activity, or as required by legal or financial regulations. Our full retention schedule is available from our office at 11 Washington Lane, Edinburgh EH11 2HA.

Your rights

Under data protection law, you have certain data subjects' rights including:

Your right of access You have the right to ask us for copies of your

personal information

Your right to rectification You have the right to ask us to rectify personal

information you think is inaccurate. You also have the right to ask us to complete information you think is

incomplete

Your right to erasure You have the right to ask us to erase your personal

information in certain circumstances.

Your right to restriction of

processing

You have the right to ask us to restrict the processing of your personal information in certain circumstances.

Your right to object to

processing

You have the right to object to the processing of your personal information in certain circumstances.

Your right to data portabilityYou have the right to ask that we transfer the personal

information you gave us to another organisation, or to

you, in certain circumstances

You are not required to pay any charge for exercising your rights. If you make a request, we have one month to respond to you.
