When you visit our website, we may collect personal information about you if you:

- o report a repair to us;
- o pay your rent;
- o apply for a house;
- o make a complaint to us;
- o complete and submit a "contact us" form to us; and
- login information

We may use this personal information to:

- o provide you with the services that you have requested from us;
- o communicate with you, including in response to any of your enquiries;
- o improve our services and respond to changing needs;
- o process your rent payments;
- o carry out repairs to your property;
- o handle and resolve complaints made by, or, against you;
- o keep the personal information that we hold about you accurate and up-to-date (if you provide any new personal information to us via the website); and
- o signpost you to organisations that can offer benefits and debt advice and support.

Who do we share your personal information with?

We may share your personal information with the following organisations for the purposes described above:

- o our contractors and suppliers, including to undertake repairs, works and maintenance;
- o organisations providing benefits advice and support; and
- Police Scotland and the local authority in relation to complaints involving anti-social or other criminal behaviour.

The Lawful Basis for Processing Your Personal Data

Under the UK General Data Protection Regulation, the lawful bases which we rely on for processing this information are:

- We have a vital interest
- We have a legitimate interest
- We are performing a public task

Transfers outside the UK and the European Economic Area

Your information will only be stored within the UK and EEA.

Were information to be transferred outside the UK or EEA we will ensure that there are adequate safeguards in place to protect your information in accordance with this notice.

How long do we keep your personal information?

We will only keep your personal information for as long as we need to for the purposes described above, including to meet any legal, accounting, reporting or regulatory requirements. More information is contained within our data retention policy and schedule which is available via our website (within Document Library)

How do we keep your personal information secure?

The security of your personal information is of paramount importance to us and we use appropriate technical and organisational measures to safeguard your personal information.

However, while we will use reasonable efforts to safeguard your personal information, the use of the Internet is not entirely secure and, for this reason, we cannot guarantee the security of any personal information that is transferred by or to you via the Internet. If you have any concerns about the security of your personal information, please contact our Data Protection Officer (DPO) for more information.

Your rights

Under data protection law, you have certain data subjects' rights including:

- Your right to object to processing You have the right to object to the processing of your personal information in certain circumstances.
- Your right to data portability You have the right to ask that we transfer the
 personal information you gave us to another organisation, or to you, in certain
 circumstances.

You are not required to pay any charge for exercising your rights. If you make a

request, we have one month to respond to you.
